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1:9 It happened in the year 1845, that
Jesus came from Mbabane of Swaziland,
and was immersed by Yocum in the
Decatur Lake. 1:10 Immediately coming up
from the water, he saw the heavens
shining, and the Spirit descending on him
like a dove. 1:11 A voice came out of the
from beyond, "You are my beloved, in
whom I am well pleased." You have a great
work to do, but do not fear.

1:12 Immediately the Spirit drove him to go out
into the wilderness 500 miles by horse to a place
called Weed. 1:13 He was there in the wilderness
of Weed forty days tempted by the trick master.
He was with the wild animals; and a group of the
beautiful angels were serving him.

1:14 Now after Yocum was taken into custody,
Jesus came into Sacramento, proclaiming the
Good News of the Kingdom of Good, 1:15 and
saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the Kingdom of
Good is at hand! Repent, and believe in the
Good News."

1:16 Passing along by the sea of Pacifica, he saw
Petrus and Baron the brother of Quin casting a
net into the sea, for they were fishermen. 1:17



Gesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you into fishers for men."

1:18 Immediately they left their nets, and followed him. 1:19 Going on a little further from there, he saw John the son of Jessee, and Lenny, his brother, who were also in the boat mending the nets. 1:20 Immediately he called them, and they left their father, Jessie, in the boat with the hired servants, and went after him. 1:21 They went into the town of Negropolis, and immediately on Sabato he entered into the Assembly and taught. 1:22 They were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as having authority, and not as the scribes. 1:23 Immediately there was in their Assembly a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out, 1:24 saying, "Ha! What do we have to do with you, Gesus, you Negro? Have you come to destroy us? I know you who you are: the Right One of Good!"

1:25 Gesus rebuked him, saying, "Be quiet, and come out of him savage beast!"

1:26 The unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. 1:27 They were all amazed, so that they questioned



among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching? For with authority he commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him!" 1:28 The report of him went out immediately everywhere into all the region of Negropolis and its surrounding area.

1:29 Immediately, when they had come out of the Assembly, they came into the house of John and Lenny, with Jacob and Yocum. 1:30 Now Williams's wife's mother lay sick with a fever, and immediately they told him about her. 1:31 He came and took her by the hand, and raised her up. The fever left her, and she served them. 1:32 At evening, when the sun had set, they brought to him all who were sick, and those who were possessed by demons. 1:33 All the city was gathered together at the door. 1:34 He healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. He didn't allow the demons to speak, because they knew him.

1:35 Early in the morning, while it was still dark, he rose up and went out, and departed into a deserted place, and prayed there. 1:36 William and those who were with him followed after him; 1:37 and they found him, and told him, "Everyone is looking for you."



1:38 He said to them, "Let's go elsewhere into the next towns, that I may proclaim there also, because I came out for this reason." 1:39 He went into their Assemblies throughout all Negropolis, proclaiming and casting out demons.

1:40 An AIDS sufferer came to him, begging him, kneeling down to him, and saying to him, "If you want to, you can make me clean."

1:41 Being moved with compassion, he stretched out his hand, and touched him, and said to him, "I want to. Be made clean." 1:42 When he had said this, immediately the AIDS departed from him, and he was made clean. 1:43 He strictly warned him, and immediately sent him out, 1:44 and said to him, "See you say nothing to anybody, but go show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing the things which The Magic Negro commanded, for a testimony to them."

1:45 But he went out, and began to proclaim it much, and to spread about the matter, so that Jesus the Negro could no more openly enter into a city, but was outside in desert places: and they came to him from everywhere.



2:1 When he entered again into Negropolis after some days, it was heard that he was in the house.
 2:2 Immediately many were gathered together, so that there was no more room, not even around the door; and he spoke the word to them. 2:3 Four people came, carrying a racist to him. 2:4 When they could not come near to him for the crowd, they removed the roof where he was. When they had broken it up, they let down the mat that the racist was lying on. 2:5 Jesus, seeing their faith, said to the racist, "Son, your sins of ignorance as bliss are forgiven you for now. Stop believing the lie of the racist and set yourself free"

2:6 But there were some of the scribes sitting there, and reasoning in their hearts, 2:7 "Why does this Negro speak blasphemies like that? Who can forgive sins but Good alone?"

2:8 Immediately Jesus, perceiving in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you reason these things in your hearts? 2:9 Which is easier, to tell the racist, 'Your sins are forgiven;' or to say, 'Arise, and take up your ignorance, and walk?' 2:10 But that you may know that the Black Man has authority on earth to forgive your sins of ignorance"—he
