A near death experience after an operation and the realisation she was living as a victim due to traumatic events in her childhood inspired Fiona Nicoll to share her experience of receiving guidance from angels in the hope of helping others realise there is life at the end of the tunnel.

(May 2010) Nicoll suffered depression on and off from a young age and was struggling to cope with her son's battle with autism. A near death experience, followed by an eye opening moment when she realised she was living as a victim inspired her to turn her life around. Using her knowledge of physics and biology, Nicoll discovered the power of positive thought or 'mind over matter'.

The dramatic changes positive thinking made to her own life prompted Nicoll to share her story with others facing similar challenges in their own lives.
