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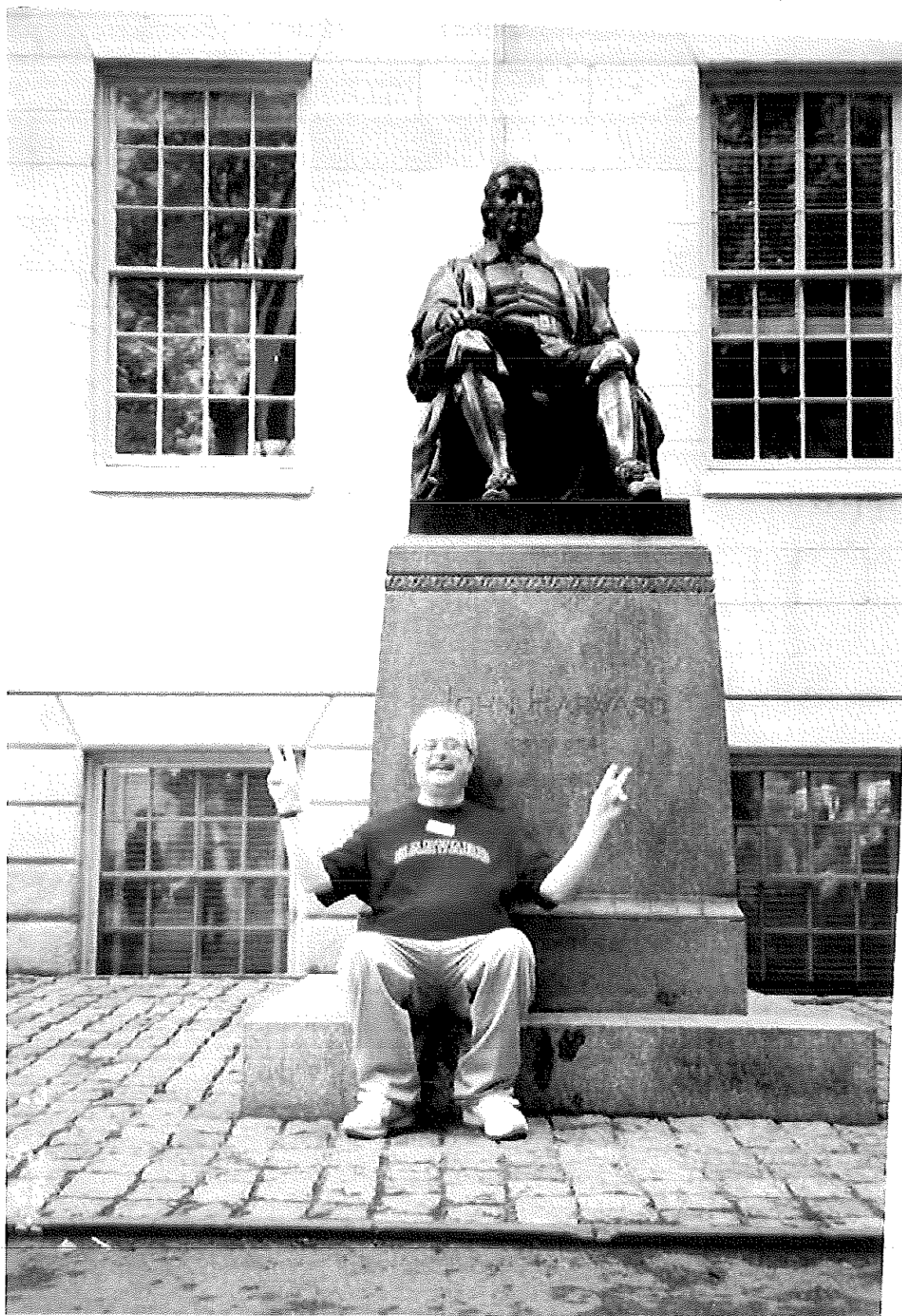

WHO: Dr. Patrick A. O'Dougherty is an Irish Catholic personalist author/activist/political prisoner and founder of Irish Catholic Revolution Publishing Press. Personalism favors the rights and responsibilities of the person in all dimensions: social, intellectual, economic, psychological, natural law, and humane religious in community. This philosophy stands versus a corporate personhood which represents an erosion of the person, community, democracy and personality. O'Dougherty is the founder of the communal property and seventh generation amendements to the Constitution.

WHAT: As a two year member of the Green Party coordinating committee, first, Patrick A. O'Dougherty, led a medical caravan to Cuba where in Santa Clara he combined focus theory with civil rights theory and the theory of civil disobedience. Second, with David Noble, historian, he made a Patrick's Cabaret film repudiating Thoreau's alienated individualism in favor of an interdependent ecological medieval community built around the Catholic idea of natural law, St. Francis of Assisi's "equality of creatures" and Pope Paul VI's renunciation of war. The House beautiful", the Stella Maria Chapel at St. John's University is a convergent point in this space of this philosophy. Third, O'Dougherty has five books featured in the Carlson Heritage Wall of Books at the University of Minnesota's McNamara Alumni Center. Fourth, O'Dougherty is trying to recapitulate or deconstruct the Thoreau experiment in the modern context, for example, Anoka Regional Treatment Center, Delta Unit. Rebirth is significant for both Thoreau and for Mark Twain. In Huckleberry Finn, Twain thought the person could be reborn by fleeing from society to nature. In Life on the River, Twain presents the river as a highway or "space" message. It leads from a bright modern North to a dark medieval South. Thoreau finds a rebirth in his alienated relationship with Walden Pond. His work is diurnal rebirthing with the cycles and seasons of Walden. In contrast, O'Dougherty's rebirthing is renewal he finds in the counter convention

20004 in Manhattan. Therapy as resistance is reborn in the streets of Manhattan.

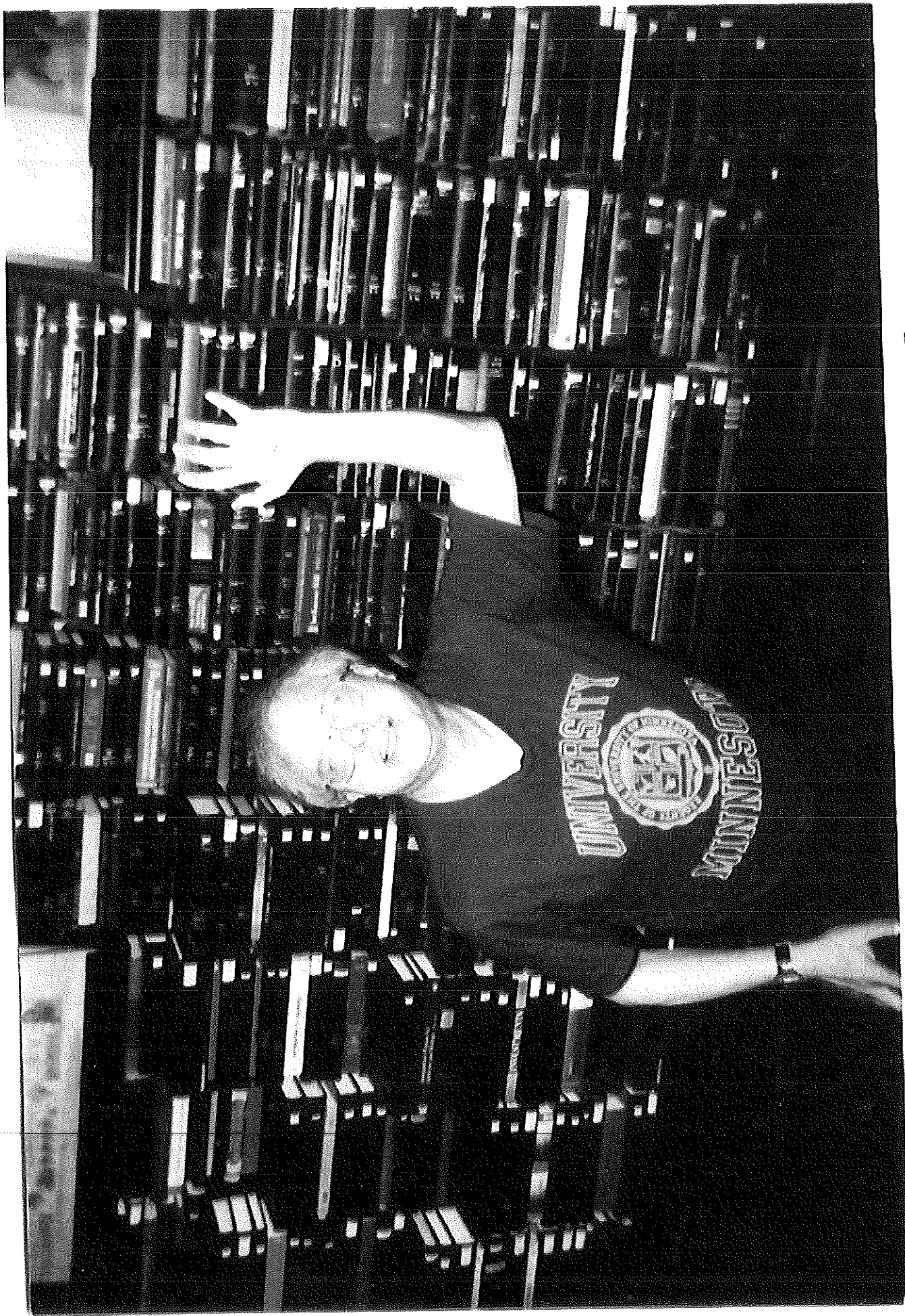

This is the journey of a prisoner of conscience that led to a prison cell and Anoka Metro Regional Treatment Center in Minnesota for a dissident Catholic writer and activist in his 50s is just one story out of the rapidly growing number of prisoners of conscience experiences in America. Patrick O'Dougherty, a Benedictine Oblate, reflects on his incarcerations, relates his experiences on two forms of incarceration, and contemplates where the journey of conscience can take us—into a new "thin space" or morality. From his journals and other related writings, O'Dougherty mixes contradictory emotions and ideas such as laughter, pain, evil and beauty to provide insight into a prisoner of conscience and political prisoner. The ironies and accidental associations of

his writings reveal the brutal nature of the American criminal justice system.

Patrick O'Dougherty was raised in a politically liberal Irish Catholic family. His father was a near classmate of Gene McCarthy. His mother, Patricia O'Dougherty, was one of Hubert Humphrey's palace guards. He was an altar boy in his youth at St. Thomas, the Apostle Grade School in South Minneapolis. He worked as a counselor/teacher on the faculty of the College of Education at the University of Minnesota as a young adult. He is a Benedictine Oblate or lay Benedictine with St. John's University at Collegeville, Minnesota. Active in the protection of Irish immigrants with Minnesotans for a United Ireland and a fellowship winner with Pastors for Peace to Cuba, O'Dougherty is also the McNamara Alumni Center Carlson Heritage Wall Scholar at the University of Minnesota. He has published ten books and numerous articles. He lives in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Introduction: Criminalizing Dissent and the Bill of Rights in Minnesota

Following the 911 attacks in New York and at the Pentagon, the Minneapolis police used the Patriot act to advocate and send a large scale message of subjects versus objects to dissidents, namely press person Patrick A. O'Dougherty, the alternative media, for example, the Green Party press and to the Twin Cities communities at large. Protestors, dissidents and activists were Code 4 categorized as enemies and forced to casual searches, illegal arrests and violence. This happened on July 8, 2002 in the Hennepin County government center.

I believe I was one of the unluckier ones in that I felt a less violent civil liberties violation arrest on July 8, 2002, while I was on my way to attend a court hearing on alleged harassment charges filed by a University of Minnesota editor, Shelly Fling. I had followed into the government center a group of 5 legal observers. They appeared to be peaceful and in high spirits. I explained to the three arresting officers that I had an alternate press pass and was here to publish a book out of the hearings. An officer took my wallet containing my press identification and confiscated it probably because he didn't think my press and legal identification were official.

ODougherty found himself the object of police harassment. The dissident was illegally detained and searched and charged with making terrorist threats.. His bond was set at \$15000 and later reduced to \$3000. These are very high figures. ODougherty was treated in the solitary confinement lockup with contempt and was subjected to repeat strip searches. He was detained for one month in the lockup on fabricated evidence. His case reflects a growing track to criminalize non-violent dissident in America and Minnesota. The Minneapolis police have turned to Red Scare or Green Scare investigation and spy policies on antiwar dissidents. Patriotism and the Patriot Act are for love of COUNTRY not love of government. The Patriot Act is the Bill of Rights.

Preface: The Stockholm Syndrome Case by Dr. Patrick A. O'Dougherty

The arrival of an Irish Catholic dissident professor on the courtroom scene in Hennepin County District Court sets the Brechtian stage for a drama in the age of the Stockholm syndrome and the Patriot Act. When the dissident concerns himself about “a Fire Next Time” at his residence and fair play sparks a contest of wills and ultimately a Green Party campaign in the Twin Cities, the resulting Mexican standoff sets a stubborn New North Judge, Richard Hopper, against a highly unlikely courtroom coalition of a Jewish woman Judge named Pat Belois, myriad legal antagonists, such as perjurer, Caroline Johnson, fabricator, Detective Charles Kelly, blackmailer, Kruckowski, and many professional corrosive value free analysis, and robust skepticism professionals. A varied group of local allies from Arise bookstore and the Resource Center of America, the Green Party and from the Catholic community join forces with O'Dougherty and his Newman postcolonial history and personal critical legal studies of which he is a founder and mentor. The resulting clash out of the Stockholm Syndrome Case becomes a testing ground for the Newman laborer character formation. The Stockholm Syndrome deals with power relationships in holocausts. The legal redemption is found in O'Dougherty's history amnesia evocation of Dred Scott in the modern. The Dred Scott Case came out of Fort Snelling. The creating the other product of a new book of Acts/Activism helps heal O'Dougherty wound that will never heal: a bias/hate crime out of a bastard with a badge experience. Dissent and civil disobedience are NOT terrorist threats.

Using many legal and psychiatric and police interviews, O'Dougherty gives voice to a remarkable and brilliant people, the Irish of Minnesota and the people of Minneapolis. He demonstrates the ironies, complexities, contingencies, and psyche and jailhouse humor which gives sustenance to these global villagers. The Minnesota Irish are a complexity.

This “twice told tale” is set at the crosshairs of dissident and community. These words come linked together in an enemy of the court system—O'Dougherty. The Stockholm Syndrome Project addresses many significant questions about the changing identities of the people of Minnesota and of the United States.

Postcolonial Dictionary:

Discourse-the construction of our conversations. This is our approach to sensing the world. Discourse is not simply a conversation.

Diaspora-Biblical Diaspora is the scattering of all peoples as the result of slavery economic desperation, or economic exploitation. O'Dougherty looks at the Bible text from the position of a subordinate methodology-a prisoner on a legal hold in Anoka, an Indian name on the River. The Death of the Master Narrative in the Book of Acts is to break the dominant methodology interpretation. Therapy, like the Book of Daniel, began as a subversive discipline. The Bible reads in the present tense. It burns in your heart a Diaspora. The heart is a hunter in a Diaspora.

Orientalism-Catholicism is an Oriental religion originating in Asia Minor. Orientalism is the naïve or forced limitation of our understanding about other groups especially Asians, Jews, or North Africans. However, there is a universal dimension to the problem of Orientalism, for example, stereotypical analysis of women, homosexuals, races such as the Irish. All nature is based on individual differences and variation.

Imperialism-The extraction of intellectual resources, minerals and culture from a non-dominant people. The Biblical figures are colonial zed and non-dominant figures.

Hegemony-This is our willing, though often unthinking participation in the social constructions of inequality and exploitation. The uses and abuses of the Bible and its history are examples of this. George Bush recently used the Bible to justify pre-emptive genocide.

Modern versus Post-Modern-The modern dominant narratives of salvation by progress, enlightenment and national technology are shattered by the post modern narrative which has no confidence in dominant master narratives. For example, the Book of Acts is the product of a subordinated epistemology-a slave Diaspora.

Text versus the Work-Traditionally, when one read a work by an author, the author, for example, Freud produced the meaning. In producing a new Book of Daniel out of my file, I will produce the meaning.

Historicism-social phenomena has political and historical character. Images of Dred Scott and the Dred Scott Case which originated in Fort Snelling appear and reappeared in my court hearings. My personal narrative is in part a slave narrative like the slave narrative, the Bible. Minneapolis is a Shiloh, a Civil War Defeat. Anoka is a personal holocaust., like Ward Churchill's holocaust interpretation of American Indian history. Dispersal and Lithium are my two drugs. They are a new small pox. Anoka is a personal Ground Zero.

Critical theory as opposed to the Scientific Method.-Self-referential thinking strives for objectivity. The problem I face is I have to acknowledge my complicity in the power relationships in my case. This is the problem of evil in my personal story. It is my personal myth. The resolution of the evil in this case is made by destroying through catharsis and new methodology the Master Narrative in the Legal System and the Medical System. For example, the DSMIV Book is a scientific objectification of slander and statistical bias. It fails to get at the Diaspora of the Heart. The legal remedy is for me to personally consume the Dread Scott Case and free this slave in the present in company, meaning with bread. My friend with bread within. Thus, my slavery to passion and vice is also freed. My own personal master narrative is dead. My own Orientalism is dead. My own constructed discourse is dead. My own imperialism is dead. My own historicism-largely American is dead. "the truth will set you free." My freedom is found in the Diaspora of my heart, which has a social as well as a personal construct.. The locus of this personal Diaspora of the heart is found, for example, in the Diaspora of the Irish, the political instability of the 1960s, the economic frustration of the present and the slavery to passion and materialism, the modern day slavery. The task of the historian or writer is to break down the master narrative within and relate it to breaking down the Imperialism and Hegemony of the master narrative of non-dominant peoples. For example, my story is part of Ward Churchill's holocaust interpretation of American history. This is my Anoka story. This is my Book of Daniel. It is my lion's den..

Personalism; A philosophy which looks at the rights, responsibility and integrity of the personal at all levels, spiritual, intellectual, emotional, social, economic, sexual, and political. I am a Catholic personalist. I am trying as a postcolonial thinker to form a critical conscience and a social conscience at all levels of my person and personality.

PSYCHOLOGICAL DISCOURSE--(n. constructions)-This is the construction of conversations. Discourse is not simply a conversation. It is our approach to sensing the world.

PSYCHOLOGICAL DIASPORA--(n. friends) A Diaspora is the scattering of all peoples as the result of slavery, economic depression, economic exploitation or psyche trauma. O'Dougherty looks at psychiatric texts from the position of a subordinate methodology. For example, he was a prisoner on a legal psychiatric commitment hold at Anoka -Metro Regional Treatment Center, in Anoka, MN. His release and subsequent scattering helped him break the dominant methodology interpretation of his clinical life. Therapy is the creation of the Death of the Master Narrative. Post-Modern psyche writing has no confidence in the dominant master narratives.

PSYCHOLOGICAL ORIENTALISM--(n. boundaries) This is the naïve or forced limitation of our understanding about other groups especially Asians, Jews, North Africans, women and homosexuals and psyche consumers. Stereotypical analysis is fallacious. Nature is based on individual differences and variation.

PSYCHE HEGEMONY--(n. exploitation) This is our willing, though often no thinking participation in the medical, psychological and social constructions of inequality and exploitation.

TEXT VERSUS WORK.--(n. my project) When one reads an author such as Freud or Harry Stack Sullivan, does this author create the meaning? My position and the postmodern position is in studying my psyche files I produce the meaning.

PSYCHOLOGICAL HISTORICISM--(n. image and reality) Social phenomena has political, historical and spiritual character. The images and reality of St. Anne de Beau Pre which originated on my 1979 Canadian pilgrimage appear and reappear in my court hearings and psyche experiences. They tie down my personal Diaspora and help break the bondage of my Master Narrative.

CRITICAL THEORY VERSUS SCIENTIFIC METHOD IN PSYCHOLOGY (n. individual variation) --Self-referential thinking strives for objectivity. The problem the client faces is acknowledging complicity in the power relationships in their case, for example, medical, family, and courts. For example, the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, DSM-IV, is a scientific objectification of slander and bias. It is a Master Narrative. Anoka-Metro Regional Treatment Center is an Indian name on the Rum River in Minnesota. My personal Diaspora and holocaust at Anoka becomes part of the holocaust interpretation of American history like that of the American Indian. My psychological holocaust breaks down my Anoka Master Narrative. Uniting my plight with colonized groups in America like the American Indians and colonized Bible figures like Daniel create a new personal narrative for me: "The Truth Will Set You Free."

ACTIVISM--(n. dissident)) This is found in fighting for psyche people, movements, and ideas., in creating works of art, in living in community, in "knocking the dust off my sandals."

PSYCHOLOGICAL DISCOURSE

In 1964 I began St. John's University at Collegeville as a freshman majoring in history, social science and education psychology . I took long fall walks with my college roommate, John Herlick, around Lake Sagetagan to the religious shrine at the other side of the lake. The changing of the trees and the Indian summer that autumn were spectacular. I also took long walks past the Monastery cemetery and then around the lake. One of the guest mentors for the students that year was Dorothy Day. In her work, *The Long Loneliness*, Dorothy resolves her personal problems with (1) the birth of her child, (2) her conversion to Catholicism and (3) in the Catholic Worker Community which she helps found. Dorothy Day is a Catholic personalist. Like Thoreau, Dorothy Day came to Minnesota to meet the Indians. I decided after hearing Dorothy Day talk that I would like to recapitulate the Thoreau and personalist philosophy in an urban context. Within the week I co-founded the University's Chapter of Students for a Democratic Society. I also began developing my own conception of personalism. Personalism is a philosophy which looks at the rights, responsibility and integrity of the personal at all levels: spiritual, physical, psychological, sexual, ethical, economic, political and social. I began trying as a novice history major to form a critical conscience, a social conscience at all levels of my person and personality. A critical conscience is a seminal part of New Abolitionist history and thought of which I later became a major founder. Following a warm family reunion in the Christmas time of 1964, I made an early return to an almost deserted campus. Something tragic happened. My isolation led to a breakdown of my sanity. Early one morning, I began having unconscious protrusions for thoughts. My unconscious became my conscious. I had feelings of great loss. My warm family relationships had been lost. I didn't feel I could recover the warmth of my youth. I had negative thoughts. After school commenced, I made an appointment with a school psychologist. I told him of my breakdown. We both decided I should transfer to more familiar surrounding and that I should attend the University of Minnesota. At the University writing became for me a way of resolving personality disintegration. Psychological discourse, personalism, and community became a construction in complexity of discourses. I started re-sensing the world through new tastes, smells, touches and sight, hearing.

PSYCHOLOGICAL ORIENTALISM--BOUNDARIES

This is a little essay in outline form about why I love the Irish.

I. Most of the relations in my Irish Catholic military family were too old to be my friends when I was a child. My mother refrained from having a large family while she was young and finished college instead.

I was born when she was twenty-six. My father who grew up without a father joined the army and didn't get married until after WWII. I am the eldest of five. My parents families were all a generation older than me. My parents defied the Irish stereotypes or psychological Orientalism of alcoholism, foolishness, self-destruction and passion. They were fun, nurturing, great conversationalists and religious and ethical.

II. The one exception is my uncle John. He was an English teacher and a marvelous story teller as well as a great companion. He had dark hair, a Gallic nose and a genetic disposition to musical greatness--the piano. John was a great mentor to me in writing, in

music and in investments. He had high standards for himself and others.

III. The clincher in my love and respect for John and Charlotte is that in their family of nine there was more than one homosexual and more than one schizophrenic. Moreover, out of the shattered stereotypes of these family members boundaries were broken. This genetic weighting frightened me as a youth.

IV. In my youth, my mother told me she didn't want me to grow up to be gay or schizophrenic. I didn't, however, in compassion I distanced my self from this judgment. Gayness, schizophrenia, and boundaries transgressed broke down the stereotypes of my Irish family that I love. I love the Irish because they are mine and because they are so individualistic. Also, I want to oppose sexism and racial stereotypical thinking on pathology generalizations.

PSYCHOLOGICAL DIASPORA OF THE HEART-A LIBRARY OF PSYCHE FRIENDS

Tom--While living at Guild, Tom also became my friend. He had a bad case of diabetes. He told me his family never Raised him to be generous. He wondered if it would be all right If he was generous with me. He gave me several of his books. Generous.

Harriet--She was not a girlfriend of mine, however, I used to go out To different restaurants and to the beach with her. She was blond, vulnerable, beautiful, Sexy, and kind to animals. And to me. Harriet was intelligent. Intelligent.

Roger--He was tall with a strange gait and with a wonderful commonplace sense of humor.

He was quite an intellectual. Roger was trained in theoretical chemistry. He went from atheist,

to Catholic, to divorced Catholic, to Christian, to atheist and finally after many dark deep valleys, he died a Catholic.

Dennis, I met Dennis at Massillon State Hospital in Massillon, Ohio. He was a fighter especially with his father. He was a great pool player. Dennis wanted to find work with me in Ohio. Street smart.

Janet--She is a great singer. She is a lot to love. She builds community. She builds family. She built me up when I was down. Great.

PSYCHE IMPERIALISM

Dear Former Psychiatrist, Dr. Michael Ekern,

I remember on our first visit you told me that you had high professional standards and ethical standards. You struck me as being very cold hearted. Later after I no longer was your client it turns out that you slandered my life style. Your evaluation of me appeared to be that of an establishment lackey rather than one of a scientist. Change in community which I stand for is often brought about by dissidents and artists who oppose having hierarchical arrangements for every organization including every medical organization. Change is revolutionary. It is brought about by a binary opposition of the anarchical and the aristocrat both within the community and within the person. I found my therapy sessions with you to be nonevents. Thus, I have decided to move on from my relationship with you and seek the passion of revolution. I desire intensity and

indeterminism. I chose not to participate in your medical construction of inequality and exploitation.

TEXT VERSUS WORK--MISDIAGNOSIS

A Letter from Dr. Jane R.

April 21, 1998

RE: Patrick O'Dougherty

Dear Dr. W.

I am writing to you about our mutual patient, Patrick O'Dougherty, who has been seeing me for outpatient individual psychotherapy since 9-8-95, approximately every two weeks. A recurring theme for Mr. O'Dougherty is his concern that he has been misunderstood. I suggested that I write this letter for him to help him "set the record straight" in some way. My concern is that I believe that Mr. O'Dougherty has been misdiagnosed as schizophrenic some years ago. I do not know when this diagnosis was first formulated. It has been continued to be given to Mr. O'Dougherty in the absence of the diagnostic criteria of Schizophrenia. Mr. O'Dougherty reports that he has never had any of the characteristic symptoms of Schizophrenia, such as delusions, hallucinations, etc.

As I have worked with Mr. O'D. and observed his functioning, I have concluded that a more accurate diagnosis would be Narcissistic Personality Disorder. Mr. O'D. has provided me with his MMPI-2 profile, which is a normal limits profile. One of the notable features of this profile is an extremely low Social Introversion score, indicating Mr. O'D.'s strong need for social interaction....

He is currently involved with Arise Bookstore...the Green Party, for which he recently became a member of the Coordinating Committee, ... the Dorothy Day Center in St. Paul...and the Benedictine Order, in which he is an Oblate. He has also recently obtained his own computer web site, and he continues his writings.

In studying my files I will produce the meanings. I am the creative type. I have creative divergent thinking due to extensive reading and writing. This is a thought style. It is not pathological. Also my "religiosity" is not pathological. I favor virtue in people, movements and in myself.

Psychological Historicism--a Pilgrimage

St. John of the Cross The traits of the solitary bird are five: first, it seeks the highest place, second, it withstands no company; third it holds its beak in the air; fourth, it has no definite color; fifth, it sings sweetly.

Psycho-social phenomena have political, historical and spiritual character. Like a solitary bird I took in 1979 a Grey Goose bus trip pilgrimage from Thunder Bay over the top of the lakes through Sudbury and Montreal, Trois Rivers to Quebec and finally to the Shrine of St. Anne De Beau Pre. The images and realities of the Shrine of St. Anne De Beau Pre keep appearing and reappearing in my life, my court trials, and in my psyche experiences. These images of healing and beauty are like "parallel dreams" in a parallel universe. The vision of St. Anne ties down my personal Diaspora or restlessness of the heart and the reality of her miracle healing helps break the bondage of my Master Narrative. A psyche pilgrimage to the Shrine of St. Anne is a personal justification of the

inner life. Cars, a new significant other, a new job will not cure your problems. A rich interior life will. Seek the highest place in therapy. Try the Canadian pilgrimage to St. Anne. Patrick

CRITICAL THEORY VERSUS SCIENTIFIC METHOD

Dear Anoka town, MN

Anoka-Metro Regional Treatment Center, Delta

Unit: RE: The Stockholm Syndrome Case: A Hate/Bias Crime Case Patrick A.

O'Dougherty was the victim of a hate/bias crime at the University of Minnesota in 2001 where he is the Carlson Heritage Wall Scholar. He was turned into the campus police by Sue Haskins, Karen Frederic, Mary Elkins, Shelly Fling, and Tara Gilsrud for passing out Irish Celtic Season's Greetings cards during the holiday or Holy Day season of Christmas which is also his birthday season. There is no case for hatred. There is no case for bias. Evidently, Sue Haskins importuned a campus police officer, Eric Steneman to front this hate crime. O'Dougherty filed a complaint with the Police Misconduct Board and the Board of Professional Standards. After having three floors directly above his apartment knocked out in criminal sabotage, O'Dougherty appealed to Shelly Fling and David F. Good of the history department for help. Five hundred to one thousand people, mainly Vietnamese and Somali's lived in his apartment building. This is the potential loss of life if there is "a fire next time." Rather than do the right thing, O'Dougherty found himself facing gross misdemeanor charges for Harassment initiated by the University of Minnesota. The apartment complex lies adjacent to the Universities property and many of the residents are students at the University. On July 2, 2002, after asking for public accountability from the judge assigned, Richard Hopper, O'Dougherty found himself charged with making terrorist threats. Requesting public accountability from a public official in Minnesota is a threat? On July 8, 2002, O'Dougherty was arrested for "causing" a disturbance at the Government Center. O'Dougherty only asked if he was in the right court room and when asked to leave he asked for his rights and responsibilities in the situation. By asking for legal rights under the Bill of Rights he was in effect held in contempt of court and then charged with one count of making Felony Terroristic Threats. This is now standard procedure for minorities and women in courts in California. On August 8, 2002, he was transferred to Hennepin County Medical Center pending a Rule 20 psychiatric evaluation. Subsequently, on 08-20-02 he was committed by Judge Pat Belois to Anoka Metro Regional Treatment Center to the Delta or legal hold unit. O'Dougherty has not been found guilty. The commitment reminded O'Dougherty of the Star legal courts in English history which were often secret courts with secret directives such as unauthorized wiretapping and surveillance and punishment rather than restorative justice sentencing. Civil disobedience, request for rights, and dissent are not threats. They are the backbone of the Bill of Rights and the American Constitution. O'Dougherty was not permitted to testify in his case. It was "alleged" he did not pass the Rule 20. Perjury, profiling, fabricated evidence, aggressive police theory which means preemptive strikes and "government people are government people" are the rule not the exception in Minnesota. This is true for O'Dougherty's psyche case. In parallel, nearly 44% of the City of Minneapolis are Afro-Americans. Nearly 1/2 of the males of this population are arrested and booked every year. Subpoenas, forgery, wire tapping, and secret courts are the rule not the exception for psyche consumers in the Twin Cities. For blowing the whistle and doing life saving good deeds and for filing against a

police officer in “a guise of friendship case,” and for rightly challenging the galloping fascism of the Patriot Act, O’Dougherty got a mockery trial in a secret court. He was warehoused as a dissident intellectual in the Delta Unit of Anoka for eight months. This is the fate of those who champion freedom in America. The three cases against O’Dougherty fall off the back burner in three years. Freedom, freedom, freedom!.

THE DEATH OF THE MASTER NARRATIVE

I would like to take this time to personally thank Larry and Karen at Anoka. Both Larry and Karen are Protestants. They both helped me develop a new socially accepting self after my hate/bias crime experience. I feel a real sense of gratitude for the new sense of self worth they gave me. I deny complicity in the power relationships in my case. My Stockholm Syndrome holocaust experience counters my Anoka and Hennepin County District Court Master Narrative. In my case, the DSM-IV is slander and bias. Reading Ezekiel’s psychotic story created a new personal narrative for me. A patient is a prophet. This is also an Irish Catholic in German Minnesota case.

ACTIVISM--NEW ABOLITIONIST HISTORY

Dear Carrie Davis, editor,

I guess I really believe in the idea of “thin spaces.” My psyche life has been a series of thin spaces. My life in art and in personalism has also been a series of “thin spaces.” In “thin spaces” subjects and myths interrelate. Another way of looking at my life is to take the “I” out of my personal narratives and replace this “I” with the name Daniel, the Jewish prophet. Likewise, history relates with narratives and myth. The process of New Abolitionist history is the creation of a critical conscience. In my life, I created a critical conscience by starting Students for a Democratic Society in the Midwest and working in the 1960s and 1970s on psyche issues in activism in the Civil Rights Movement in Atlanta, Georgia. In New Abolitionist history, the text, the reader, the critic and the movements are engaged in purposeful dialogue. Personal histories like my file at Anoka form a subterranean history. History projects are for me a way of obviating personal disintegration in face of devastating court cases like the Stockholm Syndrome Project/Case. Anoka is a “thin space.” New Abolitionism is a movement of the young and the committed which seeks to confront the moral neutrality of the often white majority. Its strength is that it does not have a fixed ideology or fixed narrative. New Abolitionists lack respect for authority. They are agitators for causes. They have restless hearts. Academic struggles lie apart for them from societal struggles. Revolution fills the voice boxes of their movement but they lack a definite creed or utopian vision. Thoreau is the hero of New Abolitionist history. New Abolitionists live in a disparate brotherhood of Catholic, Negro, Jew, Protestant, and atheist and psyche consumer. My invitation to you as an editor is to join this disparate sisterhood/brotherhood and Rally in the Rotunda of the Capitol on behalf of schizophrenics. 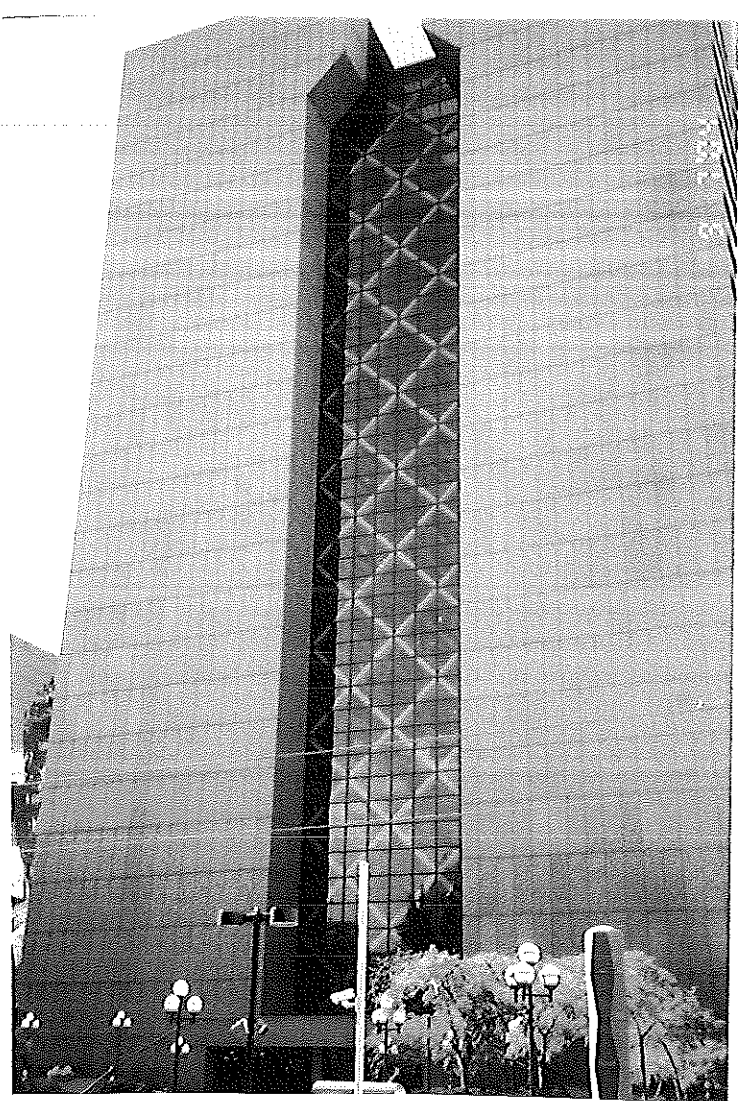

Reality: There is a Patriot Act. The Bill of Rights is a Patriot Act.

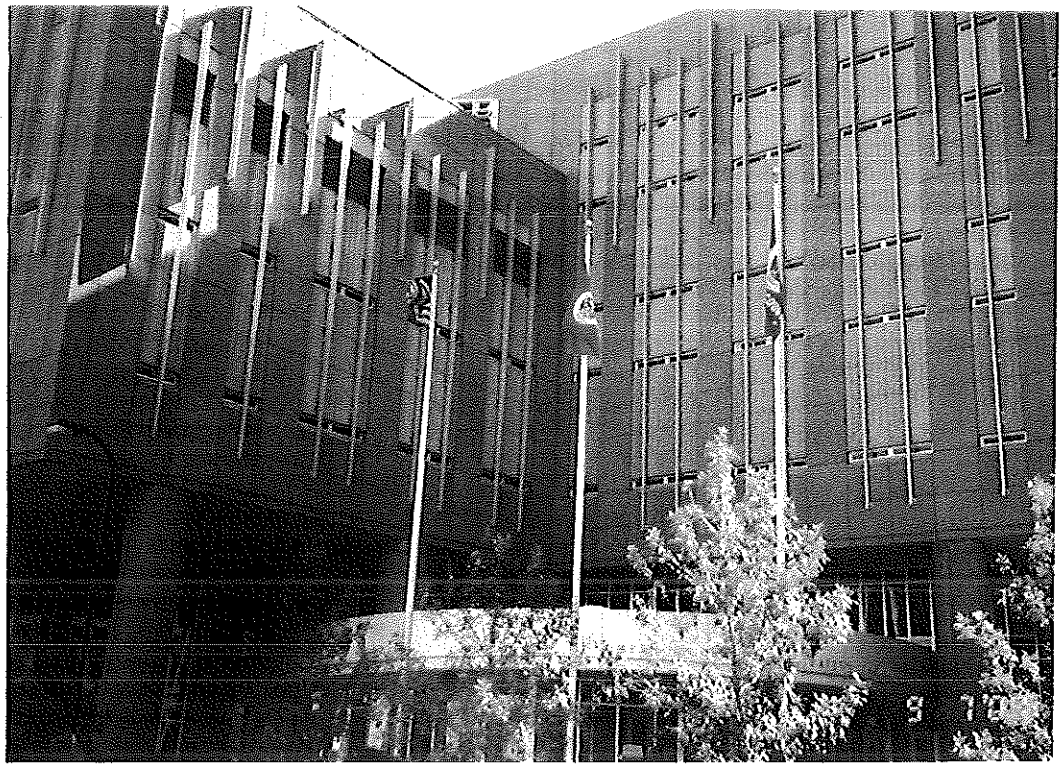

NARRATIVE, THREAD, STORY: THE BOOK OF DANIEL

12 Mathew 37 "For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned." My broken words out of Hennepin County lockup and Anoka are my gift to you. Make these broken words your strength. Make my weakness, my words, your strength.

JOHN LENNON

The beginnings of my story began with the purchase of the John Lennon Files: Gimme Some Truth by John Wiener. The trip wire for my file was the destruction of my apartment and publishing company by my landlord, Jim Daly. The truth I decided on came out of the anti-war movement. It resulted in the creation of a new Book of Daniel

DRED SCOTT: THE RETURN OF THE REPRESSED

This book is written out of "thin spaces" the Hennepin County Correctional facility, Hennepin County Medical Center and the Delta Legal Hold Unity at Anoka State Hospital. in time and it is my tribute to Dred Scott. There is a plaque to Dred Scott out at Fort Snelling. His case, in part, came out of Fort Snelling and the court house in St. Louis held the trial. On March 6, 1857, the Supreme Court led by Justice Roger B. Tancy delivered the decision against Dred Scott, the slave. Scott maintained he had been emancipated by having lived with his master in federal territory where the Missouri Compromise forbid slavery. This ruling did much more than solve the fate of an old black man and his offspring. Dred Scott v. Sanford was the first case where the Supreme Court invalidated large scale federal legislation. The court's ruling that Congress did not have power to stop slavery in the federal Territories, struck a terrible blow at the legitimacy of the new Republican party. This case intensified the sectional fight over slavery.

JUDGE WARREN BURGER: "MURDER BY FIVE"

My own personal case which arose out of filing a Stockholm Syndrome Case in the St. Paul Court System in the year 2000. The court chosen was the Warren Burger, "Mista Pack of Lies" court, Judge Murder by Five on Robert St. in downtown St Paul. The judge chosen for the case was Judge Sue Nelson. However, she lacked the ability, or guts or will to try the case.

The Stockholm Syndrome looks at power relationships in holocaust experiences. This is my personal Stockholm Syndrome Case. It is my personal Shiloh which was a civil war defeat battle. I was trying to write a work about how the United States bureau of the Census broke confidentiality and used census data to round up the Nisei Americans for there subsequent incarceration on American concentration camps. This also happened with census data in Germany for the Nazi holocaust of the Jews. Likewise in the late 1940s and 1950s government confidentiality was violated to railroad nearly 1.5 million Mexicans back across the Mexican border. For example, do the oppressed out of escapism deify the oppressor. Should I out of degradation worship the landlord and others involved in a hate bias crime case against me win my patronizing respect out of a "glory story" recapitulation of my forced cases, detention, trials and perjured testimony.?

CAMPUS EDITOR

In 2002 I was forced into a series of legal cases out of the University of Minnesota

and out of the Hennepin County Court system. One of the campus editors, Shelly Fling, filed an harassment lawsuit against me after I sent her a manuscript for review. The manuscript was returned untouched. Another one of Shelly Fling's friends, Tara Lynn Gilsrud also filed an harassment lawsuit. I had never personally met Shelly Fling. I did not know Tara other than by her first name. She is a receptionist in the McNamara Alumni Center. I am a lifetime member of the McNamara Alumni Center, a five book Carlson heritage Wall Scholar and major contributor to the University of Minnesota Endowment Fund.

OF POLITICAL PRISONER BONDAGE

The case and story/myth that is evolving has become my personal bondage narrative. The destruction of my persona and my redemption from evil was done through the catharsis of the personal relationship I developed with Dred Scott his case, his myth, his dream and his reincarnation. The body of his case story like John Brown's body was consumed by me in solitary confinement on the 8th floor of Hennepin County Lockup and in the Delta Unit of Anoka. Delta is a ironic name for this unit. My passion for justice not just-us coupled with the passion for justice sought by Dred Scott.

AN HEGELIAN PARABLE

My Hegelian parable within, the conflict between my master narrative, story, myth and my slave narrative, story and myth was resolved by releasing my slave within—my slavery to sin, passion, and excess. My case and the Dred Scott case brought about the death of my own personal master narrative, for example, egotism and over ego control. My own Orientalism ,or stereotypical thinking, is dead. My own constructed monologue is dead. I am involved in a collective dialogue which includes, the reader, the critic, the audience and the medical/legal community. My own imperialism is dead. I am at the bottom of power relationships. My own constructed historicism and legalism are reborn. My freedom was found in a new Diaspora of my heart which has a social as well as a personal construct. The locus of this personal Diaspora of my heart which has a personal as well as objective dimension is found in the legal hold at Anoka, the Diaspora of the Irish people, the political instability of the 1960s, which was my academic toilet training, the economic frustration of the present and in my resolution of the slavery to passion issues in my life, and materialism, the modern day slavery.

THE HISTORIAN'S TASK

The task of the historian is a birthing task like the birth of Israel through the migration of Moses and his people across the dessert. The historian should construct, destruct and recreate his own personal history, myth, text and narrative in acts of conscience formation, clarification and discernment such as dissent, alternative histories and truth speaking to power court cases. Then, the historian should relate his story to breaking down the imperialism and hegemony narratives of non-dominant cultures and peoples, such as women, homosexuals, and the marginalized. This is the return of the repressed in history. For example, my story is part and parcel of Ward Churchill's holocaust interpretation of American history and Dred Scott's legal loss. This is my Stockholm Syndrome story, my Anoka story. This is my New Book of Daniel.. The mind has internationality. It should lead to action.

What are the questions which make my writing? Who? I am a child of God called to focus my identity in Christ. Christ is "one way of life, one love." What? What can I do to imitate the Life of Christ? Christ's life is built around spiritual disciplines such as prayer, fasting, solitude, meditation, service, sacrifice, and a life of simplicity. His words are our food. His deeds are our body. His solitude is our reflection. His meditation and study are our nourishment. His life is a simple. His life triumphs over materialism. His prayers are our salvation.. His fasting is our victory over our passions and vice. His service to others works against vanity. Vanity vanity all is vanity. The body requires three meals a day. The soul and mind require three spiritual meals a day. For example, they require three spiritual readings, for example, readings from the New Testament, Ghandi, MLK and Thoreau. Words feed us and enable us to give. When you have affirmed the words of great spiritual masters in spite of the world's indictment of them, then your heart becomes and act of creating the other for other's in deed of faith and acts. The heart becomes a womb of faith and deeds. The art of the writer is to turn his heart into a womb, his heart into seeds of justice, truth and beauty. The diasporas of life comes to a focus within the beating of the faith creating chamber of the heart. The internationality of the mind and the heart direct themselves to others in acts of recreating the other in relationships.

Where? My story occurs within the Lion's Den, the lockup in Hennepin County Detention Center, Hennepin County Hospital, Anoka State Hospital—Delta Unit, and my apartments, one destroyed, one rebuilt or recreated. This lockup formed my critical conscience.

How? My dissent, my civil disobedience make my cell Christ's cell, Thoreau's cell, Martin Luther King's cell, Hindi's cell, Daniel Berrigan's cell. It is Dred Scott's cell. It is Russell Means' cell. It is your cell as well. My cell is Daniel's lion's den.

When? The concept of generation, for example, the boomer generation, relates to the judgment of history. I am a postcolonial historian involved in making judgments on people, places, ideas and events in history or her story.. Judgment is an act of generation, creation or othering. The Counter Convention I helped build was an intergenerational act of renewal.

The Biblical Judgment of History: For the present day judgments of history, I choose two Bible passages.

12 Mathew: The queen of the South will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon and condemn it, for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and indeed a greater than Solomon is here.

12 Mathew 39 "An evil and adulterous generation seeks after a sign, and no sign will

be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah.

SYNOPSIS—My capture rescue narrative fantasy story like the John Lennon FBI story dovetails out the Book of Daniel In America and in Hamburg the Smith Act, the McCarran Act and the Patriot Act are New forms of Hammurabi's code and Draconian laws. They are cryptic fascistic laws standing in denial of dissent and civil disobedience which are the foundation stones of the American Revolution reflected, for example, in the writings of Emerson, Thoreau and Jefferson.

Dred Scott is an apocalyptic redemptive son of Daniel. John Lennon, like myself, is a dissident against the Draconian laws of Hamburg and Minnesota and its people. Lennon and myself are sons in dissidence and civil disobedience, like Dred Scott.

CONTINUING THE NARRATIVE THREAD STORY

Environmental issues do shape the narrative. The landscape I found myself in was the landscape of a prison cell, a cement Walden Pond. On the 8th. Floor of Hennepin County Lockup. It is a type of dessert. It is a sensory deprivation experiment. This sensory deprivation experiment created for me a number of conscious and unconscious protrusions. The unconscious protrusions I had were anger, doubt, angst, and also hope. I was distracted for much of the time and I felt a great disconnect from my family, friends and community. The stone, glass and metal in my cell was like a perverted twisted distorted pyramid. My bed was quite narrow and I was allowed only two books in my cell at a time. One of the books I read was the Koran. I built the work into my interior life. The cell I found myself contained my food, my books and my sandwiches. The intrusions of the guards and the checks ups in my cell turned my life into a petrified forest. The police were like petrified trees. The cell fronted a circular area which contained a TV. The sound and the intensity of the TV distracted me and made me feel like I was in an electromagnetic field force. The shower of the unit reminded me of Auschwitz. I was in Andersonville in Minneapolis. Also, the cell was like and Irish monks cenobite cell in the stone clay of Ireland.

THE BOOK OF DANIEL

Four Young Israelites, Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, were introduced into the Babylonian Court. Daniel decided he would not defile himself with drinking and food. For doing this, Daniel received favor from the palace master. He was tested for ten days on royal rations. He ate vegetables rather than royal rations. Nebuchadnezzar had a dream he required his subjects to reveal but he would not reveal. Facing destruction, Daniel requested time to interpret the king's dream. Daniel told the king his dream contained thoughts of the hereafter, and the revelation would be regarding what is to come. There is a great statue containing a form with a chest, arms, and legs of iron. The dream is about the statue. Kingdoms will follow yours. However, God will set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed. This is the interpretation of the dream.

A. IMAGE GOLDEN

King Nebuchadnezzar made a golden statue whose height was sixty cubits and set it on a

plain in Babylon. He commanded the people to worship this statue. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego did not worship the god of Nebuchadnezzar. For this they were bound and thrown into a furnace. However, Nebuchadnezzar freed them from the furnace.

A SECOND DREAM

King Nebuchadnezzar had a second dream involving a tree at the center of the earth. A holy watcher ordered him to cut down the tree. Daniel interpreted the dream as a destruction of the king and his kingdom. The kingdom will be reestablished when the king learns Heaven is sovereign. Following this, King Nebuchadnezzar was humiliated by being driven from society. Later, in repentance the king turned to God in praise.

Writing during a feast appeared on wall. Daniel interpreted the writing on the wall. The writing inscribed was MENE, MENE, TEKEL AND PARSIN. Mene means God has numbered the days of your kingdom. Tekel means you have been weighed and found wanting. Parsin means your kingdom is divided and given to the Medes and Persians.

For virtue and brilliance a plot was developed against Daniel. King Darius had him thrown into a den of lions. An angel saved Daniel from the lions. Later Daniel had a vision of four beasts. Daniel's vision was interpreted. Four kings shall arise in place of the four beasts. However, the holy ones shall receive the kingdom forever. Still later Daniel had a vision of a Ram and a Goat. The male goat is the king of Greece. The ram stands for four kingdoms.

Daniel was given seventy weeks to atone for his people Israel for iniquity. The king of the south will arise against the king of the north. This will happen at the end of time. Daniel will arise with the resurrection of the dead.

PATRICK'S NARRATIVE THREAD STORY

After a court hearing I was transferred to Hennepin County Medical Center for treatment and evaluation. Dallas Erdmann was my doctor. I had several Afro-American roommates who I do not remember very well. However, one of them had done extensive traveling. The evaluation I had reminded me of an interrogation by undercover FBI investigators rather than by doctors. I was tricked into a schizophrenia classification. The best part of HCMC was the occupational therapy. I made a beautiful shirt and a necklace. Since I had a plea of not guilty, I could not be placed in a prison. In September, I was transferred to Anoka Regional Treatment Center, Delta Unit, the legal hold unit. My roommate was a Palestinian American, named Andrew Hyatt. In effect, I was a dissident writer rounded up with the Arabs in Minnesota as part of the Patriot Act. Andrew Hyatt was later sentenced to prison because he had hit a police officer during an arrest. Palestinians are part of the return of the repressed in American history.

ROOMATES

My second roommate was named Tanno. He is Finish. He heard voices. I was given a number of evaluations and daily therapy at Anoka. I also frequently attended the religious services. After about a month I got privileges and could

go to the library. The most powerful stories I heard were the AA meeting stories of recovering alcoholics. My last roommate at Anoka was Adrian. He was a golden glove fighter with anger problems.

PATRICK'S STORY THREADS WITH DANIEL'S

I did a lot of spiritual reading while at Anoka. One of the books that fascinated me was the book of Daniel. Daniel goes to live in another land in exile. Likewise, I am in the small Irish Catholic Minneapolis minority category. In Babylon Daniel does, like I have done in Minneapolis, great deeds of justice, charity, asceticism and dream interpretation. He is given great honors for his contributions. Like Daniel, I have interpreted dreams. I wrote a book on Shakespeare's DreamWorks. The title of the work is Shakespeare: Dream Work, Personality and Complexity. Shakespeare is a Nebuchadnezzar figure in my life. I also looked at issues similar to the ones Daniel looks at in his story. Daniel has a vision of a Ram and a Goat. The ram is the kingdom of Greece. The goat is a four kingdoms vision. I looked to the Greek prophet, Tiresias, who was felled for truth. I felt the days of my kingdom were numbered. The Golden Image in Daniel is found in 911.

Daniel, like myself, was placed in a lion's den for his great honors. This is my Babylonian Captivity in Minneapolis. I am the Carlson heritage wall scholar at the University of Minnesota. I am a founder of the Green Party and a new Thoreau figure in Minnesota. My story contains terrible rejection and abuse. I was freed like Daniel by an angel. I was freed by my prayers. After a stay in Como Community Unit, I was released to Wilder Senior High Rise in the Frog town area of St. Paul. I went to work for the House of Charity as a food preparer.

A NEW BOOK OF ACTS OUT OF MINNESOTA ACTIVISM

Another Biblical book that fascinated me while I was at Anoka was the Book of Acts. Christ leaves the Apostles the Holy Spirit in this work. Then the Apostles proceed to set up the hierarchy of their church and they began preaching and teaching the gospel. The apostles are arrested like I was and are freed. They are trying to set up God's Church on earth. Everything in the Catholic Church is traced backwards to the Book of Acts--to the presence of the Holy Spirit. I decided while reading this work to relate my activism to the construction of a new Book of Acts which is my spirit. The 911 terrorism inspired my efforts.

THE ANTI-WAR MOVEMENT: A NEW BOOK OF ACTS

I joined the anti-war movement. The anti-war movement was inspired by the fall of the World Trade Center and the strike on the Pentagon. The World Trade Center and the Pentagon are craven images. There was no blood and personality or animal images in these craven objects. Will the fall of these craven idols bring about the fall of other walls such as the wall of hatred, the wall of injustice, the wall of prejudice and the wall of ignorance? Hopefully, the fall of walls will lead to a new solidarity of the human family.

My new book of Acts has four ingredients:

- (1) An Arise Bible passage for empowerment and reflection on the images and text.
- (2) An image and theme of Dred Scott in the narrative
- (3) An application to your life. Making the ordinary special
- (4) An action on your part to breakdown the Master Narratives in your life and in my case.

My file, for example, should be interpreted from three levels: (1) literal, (2) figurative (3) mystical. For example, the literal reading of the file should be turned into an exercise in the death of the master narrative. The Dred Scott images and themes and the New Book of Daniel should be translated at a mythical figurative level. A political prisoner has a mystical relationship with the Biblical prisoners.

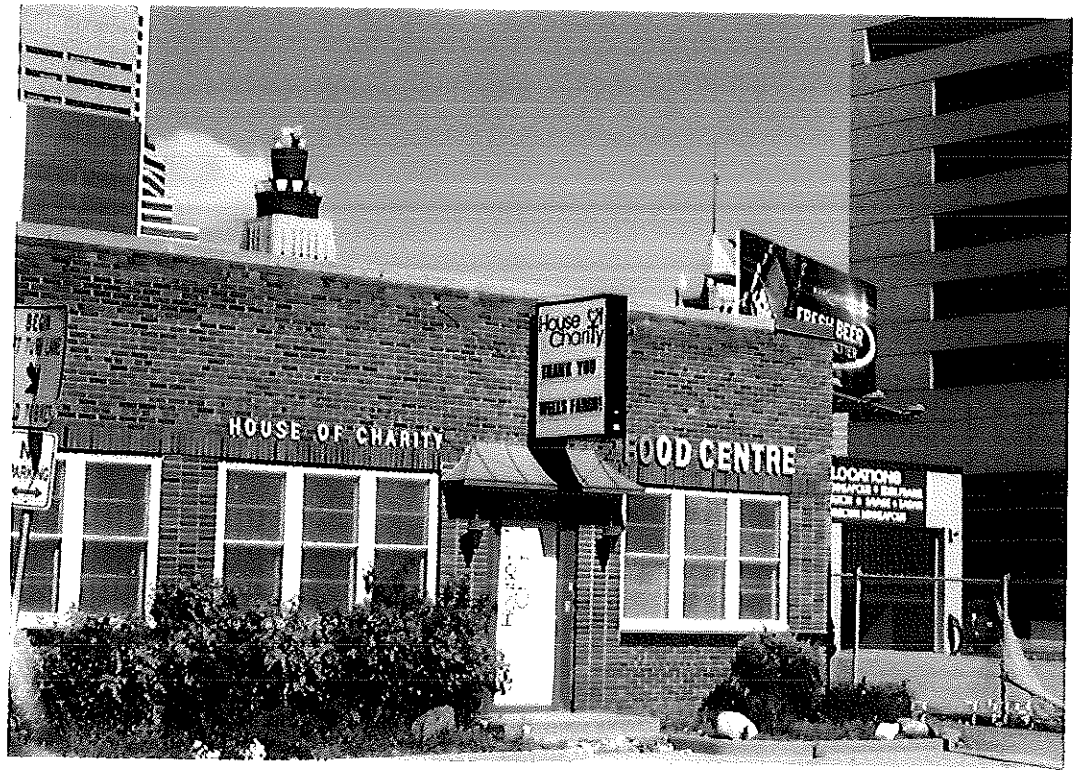
Four Levels:

A person has four levels. The first level is the sense level. The second level is the conscious level. The third level is the subconscious level. The fourth level is the soul level. Each of these levels comes into play in a meditation process. The sense level is the reading phase. The mind level is the cognitive phase. The heart level is the speaking out loud phase. The soul level is the listening phase. The convergence of these levels is centering prayer. Lectio Divina is making the spiritual break into the ordinary life of a person. Make the reading of my case and file a Lectio Divina.

A POST BRECHTIAN DRAMA: THE COUNTER CONVENTION

My political prisoner activism resulted in a new literary approach to medical files. After the end of my legal hold on August 19th, 2004, I decided to go with the anti-war committee to form a Counter Convention to the Republican National Convention in Manhattan, 2004. Out of a series of readings at Patrick's Cabaret, I developed a post-Brechtian theory of drama which I will in this work apply to my file. Personalist community building drama like the Counter Convention break down the Master Narrative in my file. My file and the Counter Convention Caravan pictures which lace my file breakdown the story in my file of arrest, criminalization, rejection and abuse. Therapy becomes resistance. Therapy is a peace caravan. Therapy is social drama community building. My file contains images of Dred Scott as well. These images counter the realities of the file. The images of Dred Scott and the caravan members represent the return of the repressed. They are images of peacemakers, gays, youths, Afro-Americans, laborers, radicals, Orientals, Guatemalans, and Christians in community creation. A new Book of Acts, personalist drama, and the return of the repressed breakdown the master narrative of my medical and legal files. This follows.

Angela Davis & Patrick A. O'Dougherty: the Psyche-Industrial Complex

Psyche hospitals and psychotherapy clinics are becoming a critical part of the U.S. economy and landscape, for example, the economy of the State of Minnesota. Many of the most profitable stocks traded on Wall Street are the pharmaceuticals especially psychiatric drugs. This means there are goals other than anti-pathology stakes, which will keep the psyche industry expanding. The psyche industry is acquiring its own momentum. This is a frightening phenomenon because America will become an increasing hospitalized society in the next millennium. This frightens me because I have been there and I am a survivor.

Patrick O'Dougherty traces his own track to activism from the bombing the Federal Building in downtown Minneapolis during the war in Vietnam through his political work around the incarceration the Puerto Rican political prisoners, namely Carmen Valentin, and Afro-American activist Janet Jackson, and to his anti-hospitalization work today.

Why is it that the psyche population continues to expand (1/4 to 1/5 of the population of Minnesota and America are mentally ill) as psyche pathologies in many categories are declining? Patrick O'Dougherty a political prisoner and presently a leading voice in the struggle against forced hospitalization demonstrates ways the wars on drugs and forced structural unemployment are directly tied to amoral and mobile transnational corporations. He argues vehemently that fear of psyche people and psyche population targeting is being used to create one of the world's most profitable industries—the psyche-industrial complex. America has a complex problem.

Patrick O'Dougherty is a research professor at the University of Minnesota. He is a key organizer of the Resource Center for the Americas and Arise Bookstore and Resource Center. He is a founder of Critical Conscience Resistance: Beyond the Psyche Hospital Industrial Complex out of his stay as a political prisoner in Hennepin County Lockup, Hennepin County Medical Center and Anoka Metro Regional Treatment Center.

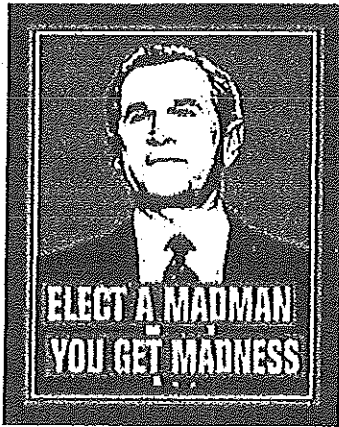

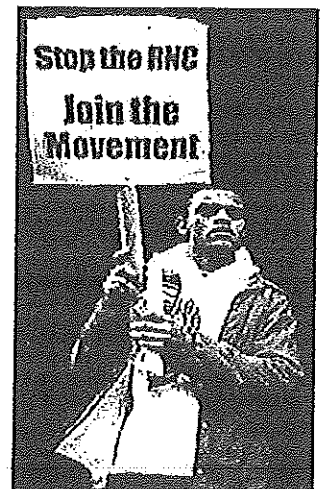

THEORIES OF DRAMA

Brecht, Bertolt, playwright

(b. Feb. 10, 1898, Augsburg, Ger. --d. Aug. 14, 1956, East Berlin),

Brecht was a poet, theater reformer, and playwright whose epic theater developed a drama as a platform for social and ideological leftist causes. Brecht lived in Bavaria until 1924 where he studied medicine and produced his first play, *Baal*, 1923, his success, *Drums in the Night*, 1922 and a *Manual of Piety*, 1966)

During this time he developed an antibourgeois attitude that mirrored his generation's disappointment with a civilization that fell at the end of WWI. He was friends with the Dadaist group who condemned bourgeois art with derision and iconoclastic satire. Karl Korsch taught him the elements of Marxism.

In Berlin (1924-33) he worked for Max Reinhardt and Erwin Piscator, directors. During this time he wrote "exemplary plays" which were didactic works made for performance outside of standard theaters. In 1933 he went to Denmark in exile. He moved to the United States where he did film production in Hollywood. His books were banned in Germany. In 1941 *Mother Courage* a play of the Thirty Years war was produced. In 1957 he produced *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*, a play set in prewar Chicago of Hitler's rise to power. *The Caucasian Chalk Circle*, 1948, was Brecht's story of the fight for possession of a child by its well born mother and the servant girl who keeps it. Brecht left the United States in 1947 after testifying before the House Un-American Activities Committee.

Theory of Drama: In his work "A Little Organum for the Theatre," Brecht argued Marxist drama should avoid the Aristotelian thesis the audience should believe they are seeing what is happening here and now. If the emotions of the heroes of the past, for example, Oedipus, Hamlet or Richard III, were their own responses, then the Marxist idea human nature is not a constant but the product of historical conditions would be flawed. What is on the stage is an account of historical events which should be analyzed with detachment. Epic theater is based on alienation and detachment. Theater is not the world itself. He received the Stalin Peace Prize in 1955. Brecht was an ironic humorist but was poor in giving his creations shape and tension. He made plays out of his preferences and his faults. *His Life, His Art, and His Times* were communist times.

Post-Brechtian Drama

O'Dougherty, Patrick, actor.

(b. December 11, 1946, St. Cloud, Minnesota. O'Dougherty is an actor, author, critic who has developed a personalist epic theory of drama out of his involvement with Dorothy Day and the Green Party. Personalism is a philosophy which looks to the integrity of the person in all dimensions, for example, spiritual, economic, social, political and sexual. A person has an objective dimension as well as a subjective dimension. In

terms of the nature/nuture controversy, Brecht favors the nurture dimension of the historical and economic environment. He denies the importance of the fallen nature of the person. My position as a personalist is the person has a hardware dimension and a software programmable dimension. Human nature is not just a product of changing historical circumstances. In my Stockholm Syndrome Case, the arrest and detention create feelings of alienation, subjection, hatred, bias, depression and anxiety. However, both myself and the environment are responsible for these feelings. My feelings of alienation are different from Marxist alienation because I can resolve the alienation. I feel for many of the people in the Cast of Characters by resistance to oppression, constructive social change, and meditative writings. Unlike Marxist alienation, my person is not suppressed in a class struggle. I have control of my situation and can resolve the alienation in communal solidarity. What appears on a stage should be viewed with commitment and involvement rather than detachment and alienation. Plays should lead to constructive social and political action in the world. The theater has direction to the external world. The strengths of my case are my weaknesses. They give the figurative epic dimensions to my struggles. The theater stands in the historical tradition of Patrick Henry, Sojourner Truth, Dred Scott, Frederic Douglass, William Lloyd Garrison, Eugene Debs, Farrell Dobbs, MLK, Ghandi, Gene McCarthy and Patrick O'Dougherty. Acting leads to action. Read my case as a Manual of Courage. Good theater leads to good community building--"a city on a hill." This is the social reform school of theater. The Counter Convention in Manhattan 2004 comes out of theatrical readings. It is a product of this school of theater.

Dear Dr. Werner:

I am writing to you about our mutual patient, Patrick O'Dougherty, who has seen me for outpatient individual psychotherapy since 9-8-95, approximately every two weeks.

A recurring theme for Mr. O'Dougherty is his concern that he has been misunderstood. I suggested that I write this letter for him to help him "set the record straight" in some way. My concern is that I believe that Mr. O'Dougherty has been misdiagnosed as schizophrenic some years ago. I do not know when this diagnosis was first given to him, but he continued to be given to Mr. O'D. in the absence of the diagnostic criteria of any form of Schizophrenia. Mr. O'D. reports that he has never had any of the characteristic symptoms of Schizophrenia, such as delusions, hallucinations, etc.

As I have worked with Mr. O'D. and observed his functioning, I have concluded that a more accurate diagnosis would be Narcissistic Personality Disorder, with elements of Schizotypal Personality Disorder. Mr. O'D. has provided me with his MMPI-2 profile, which is a normal limits profile. One of the notable features of this profile is an extremely low Social Introversion score, indicating Mr. O'D.'s strong need for social interaction. Mr. O'D. has made significant progress in finding appropriate outlets for his social needs, in finding friends and causes where he is appreciated, so that he stays constructively occupied.

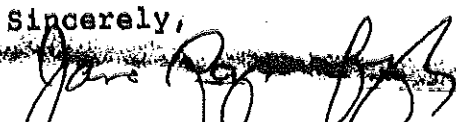
After his difficult experience with the Newman Center several years ago, he has made what seem to be positive connections with various organizations and causes to find outlets for his intense intellectual interests and considerable energy. He is currently involved with Arise Bookstore, where he is a volunteer; the Green Party, for which he recently became a member of the Coordinating Committee; the Computer Resource Center at Riverside Plaza; the Dorothy Day Center in St. Paul; the Legion of Mary; and the Benedictine Order, in which he is an oblate. He has also recently obtained his own computer web site, and he continues his writings.

Mr. O'D. keeps in touch with several friends he has had since childhood and reports ~~what seem~~ to be good connections with several individuals at the University. He is working to establish more positive connections with members of his family, as he tries to become aware of the importance of ~~being less~~ critical of them to foster positive relationships. He is also becoming aware that he needs to work to develop empathy for the needs and feelings of others, which is difficult for him to do. Although Mr. O'D. has written some letters to family members that strike me as harsh and critical, he values his family connections and loves his family members dearly. He longs for appreciation and attention from them, and we are working together to help him develop the interpersonal skills to achieve the kinds of relationships he wants.

I should also add that Mr. O'D. has been a very responsible and cooperative patient in our work together, always reliable with appointments and in making efforts to improve his life.

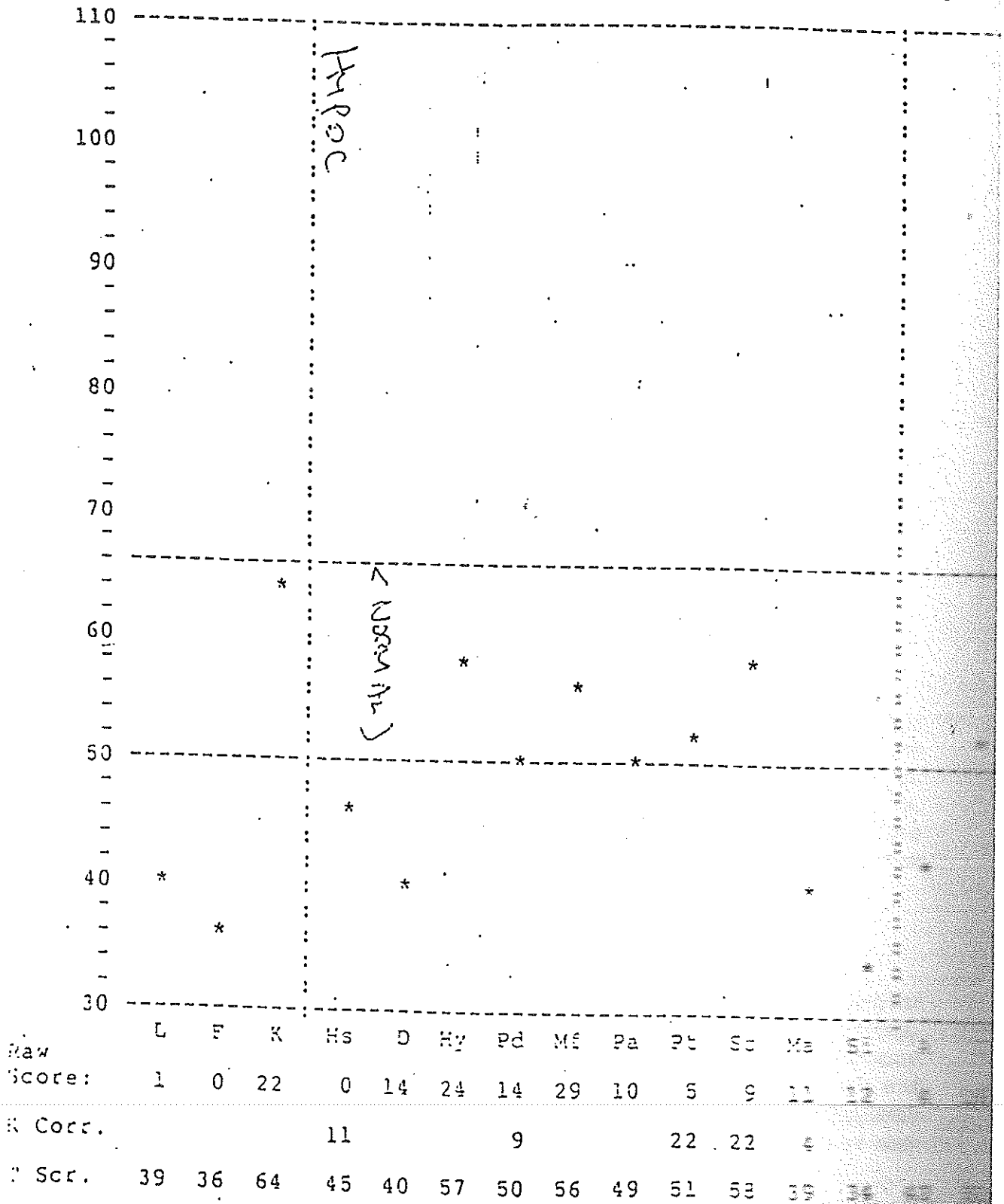

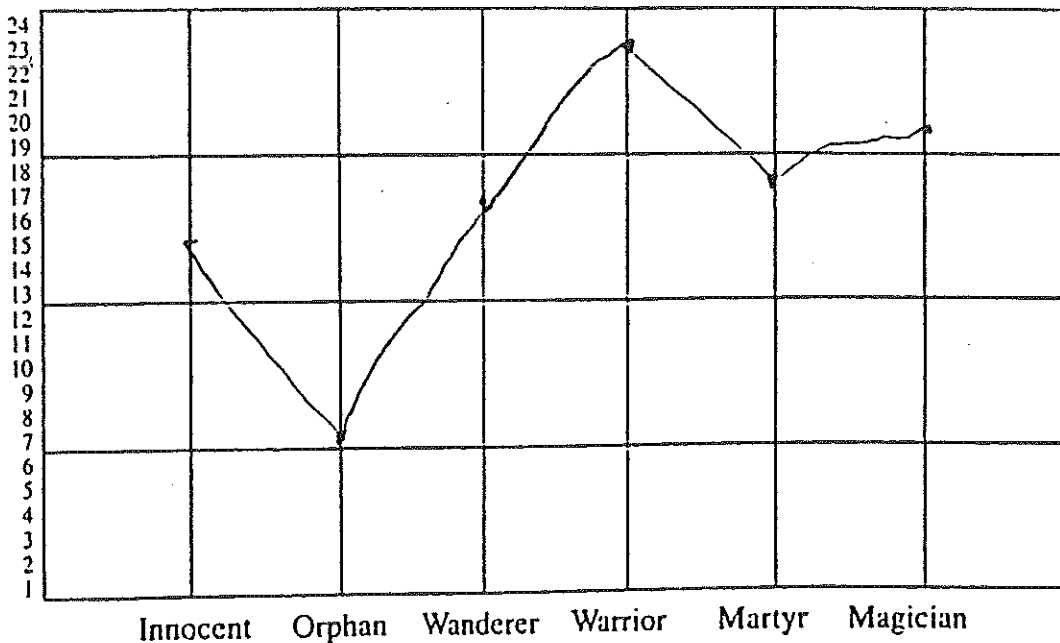

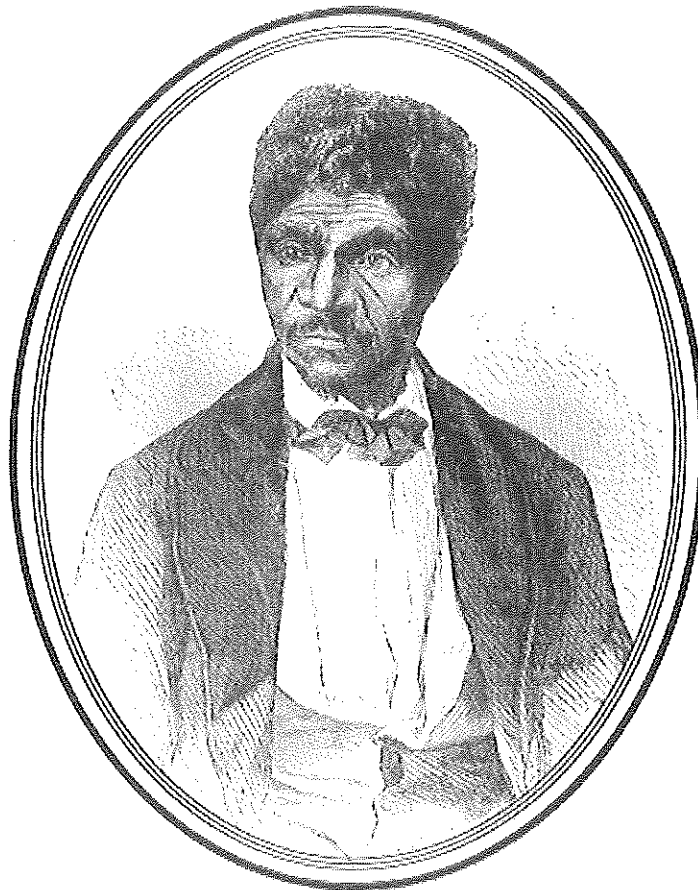

Images of Dred Scott in the Stockholm Syndrome Case out of Fort Snelling: the Return of the Repressed

On March 6, 1857, Chief Justice Roger B. Taney decided against Dred Scott. Scott was a slave who argued he had been freed as a result of having lived in federal territory with a master. In the federal territory, slavery was forbidden by the Missouri Compromise. In *Dred Scott v. Sandford* the Supreme Court first invalidated a piece of federal legislation. It decided Congress had no power to prohibit slavery in federal territories. This struck a blow at the new Republican party and heated up the sectional conflict over the slavery issue. The Dred Scott Case reviews the legal bases of slavery, Constitutional issues of slavery, and territorial expansion. A major part of the Dred Scott case took place at Fort Snelling, Minnesota. The trial was held in a courthouse in St. Louis, Missouri. There is a plaque to Dred Scott at Fort Snelling. Images of Dred Scott in my case represent a return of the repressed in history.
