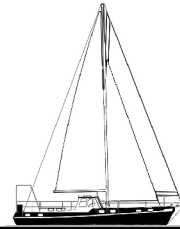


Curatians

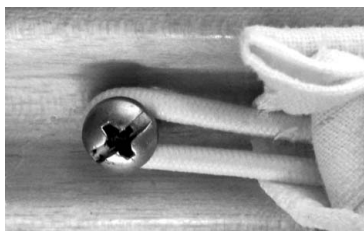


My curtains can be removed without leaving unsightly wire or pelmets.

Stretch curtains across ports easily when privacy is required, or leave up permanently. Calico still lets the light in. Fix a stainless steel round headed screw each side of the window. Leave a 3 mm gap behind.

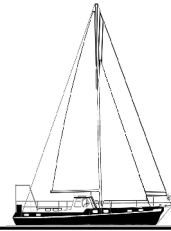


Slot 3 mm white shock cord (the type bought from sewing supply stores) through the curtain tape. Make a loop each end. Sew in place after first stretching across the window to fit. Slip loops over screws.



Tip. Initially calico needs to be washed and ironed. But after that I just give them a good shake after washing.

Dry Food Lockers



This dry food storage locker under a seat is fully sealed against possible ingress of water from below floor level.

The hull is protected with outdoor carpet.

Next to the galley, it's easily accessible. for everyday dry

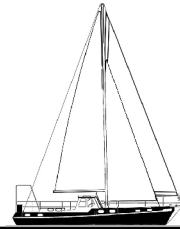


Cruising long term, it's impossible to store everything in separate screw top containers.

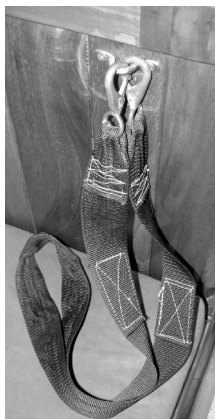
Tip.

Zip-lock bags are useful for storing dry goods weighing less than 1 kg

The Safety Strap



The safety strap clips around the front of the galley to the right of the drawers.

In really heavy weather on the starboard tack I'm safe in the galley.

Note that the galley strap does not go in front of the stove.
