

My Thoughts on Binding and Loosing

When I look back on my life and how I was personally trained by the Holy Spirit, mainly because the churches I grew up in did not accept God moving in miraculous ways.

I wonder about this message and how, by His guidance, I can articulate what is in my heart concerning the power of binding and losing, and this is what I have come to believe.

When we enter a service, and we are fasted and prayed up, we are more open to hearing the Holy Spirit's whispering voice.

We just read about a stronger man coming in and binding up the strong man. Thus, we know the scripture in 1 John 4:4 says, “Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world.”

Using the delegated kingdom authority spoken of in Luke 22:29, which the Father delegated to Jesus, which in turn He delegated unto His church.

Church, we that make up the body of Christ on Earth, have been given the same authority as Christ, as stated in Ephesians 1:17-23. These scriptures reveal that Christ gave all the power granted unto Him to His church.

(Ephesians 1: 17-18) (17) “That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him:” **(18)** “The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints,”

(Ephesians 1: 19-23) (19) “And what *is* the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power,” **(20)** “Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set *him* at his own right hand in the heavenly *places*,” **(21)** “Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come:” **(22)** “And hath put all *things* under his feet, and gave him *to be* the head over all *things* to the church,” **(23)** “Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all.”

After a thorough examination of the scriptures—specifically Matthew 18:8, Proverbs 3:3, and Isaiah 58:6—I have arrived at an enlightening understanding of our responsibility to exercise the authority conferred upon us as believers, and begin praying in Apostolic authority.

We need to recognize the need to bind the strong man, effectively restraining him hand and foot within individuals who are either demon-possessed or under the influence of demonic forces.

It is crucial not to leave these individuals bound in desperation or torment. Instead, we are called to exercise our God-given authority to release them from these demonic influences, thereby breaking any generational curses or negative patterns that may have been affecting them.
